However, the General Council Meeting was scheduled on 05 April 2020 but cancelled due to lockdown declared in view of COVID-19'. During the year 2018-2019 there were three endowment lectures were held, such as-1. 12 th K.C. Basu Endowment Lecture by Prof. Prabhat Patnaik, held on 16 th March 2019.2. 6 th Sri M.K. Nambyar Endowment Lecture by Hon'ble Justice D.Y. Chandrachud held on 2 nd March 2019.3. 12 th D.D. Basu Endowment Lecture by Hon'ble Justice Jasti Chelameshwar held on 23 rd February 2019. We have published our Journals, namely NUJS Law Review, Journal of Indian Law and Society and online journal namely International Journal of Law and Policy Review and NUJS Journal of Regulatory Studies. Our Faculty members had published some articles and research papers in good journals. The student body namely SJA conducted their regular Informal Discussion, Weekly Lectures, and Seminar lectures besides their annual sports and cultural programme. The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS) Kolkata recorded the highest number of placements across all National Law Universities (NLUs) in the country for its graduating Batch of 2018. A total number of 84 students (graduating batch of 113 students) were placed in the recruitment process, either by the Campus Recruitment Committee ("CRC") or through offers outside the college recruitment process. Chapter I

The University Statute - Relevant Provisions

ANNUAL REPORT (Clause 26 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

- 1. The Executive Council shall prepare the Annual Report containing such particulars as the General Council may specify, covering each financial year, and submit it to the General Council on or before such date as may be prescribed by the regulations. The General Council may pass resolutions thereon and the Executive Council shall take action in accordance therewith. The action taken shall be intimated to the General Council.
- 2. Copies of the Annual Report, along with the resolution of the General Council thereon, shall be submitted to the State Government. The State Government shall lay the same before the State Legislature at the earliest session.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT (Clause 24 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

- 1. The Annual Accounts of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Executive Council.
- 2. The auditors appointed by the Executive Council shall audit the accounts of the Executive Council.
- 3. The General Council shall consider the annual accounts, for approval, at the annual meeting. The General Council may pass resolutions with reference thereto and communicate the same to the Executive Council. The Executive Council shall consider the suggestions made by the General Council, and take such actions thereon as it thinks fit. The Executive Council shall inform the General Council at its next meeting of all the actions taken by it or the reasons for not taking any action.

FINANCIAL ESTIMATES (Clause 25 of the Schedule to the WBNUJS Act)

- 1. The Executive Council shall prepare, before such date, as may be prescribed by regulations, the financial estimates for the ensuing year and place the same before the General Council.
- 2. The Executive Council may, in the case where expenditure, in excess of the amount provided in the budget is to be incurred or in the case of urgency, for reasons to be recorded in writing, incur expenditure, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be specified in the regulations. In cases where no provision has been made in the budget, in respect of such excess expenditure, a report shall be made to the General Council at its next meeting.

This is the Eighteenth Annual Report for the period from April, 2018 to March, 2019, which is being submitted to the General Council for its consideration and appropriate action. This report, as required, is accompanied by the audited accounts for the mentioned period.

Chapter II

Constitution of the University Bodies

According to the terms of Section 8 of the WBNUJS Act, 1999, the authorities of the University shall be (1) the General Council, (2) the Executive Council, (3) the Academic Council, (4) the Finance Committee and such other authorities as may be declared by the University. Composition of these bodies has been prescribed in the Schedule to the Act.

The Centre had however become non-functional on account of the refusal of the Acting Vice-Chancellor (Mr. Amit Talukdar) to renew the MoU with UNICEF or to clear any of the bills relating to the Centre. As a result of this funding had ceased and all the activities of the Centre came to a complete hall. The only activity undertaken was to periodically attempt to convince Mr. Talukdar to clear the bills, submit the pending utilization certificates and renew the relationship with UNICED—all of which he was unwilling to do.

Most of the research and extension activities that I was pursuing was through the Centre for Child Rights. However, as explained in the paragraph above, all of that had come to a standstill. Thus, activities worth about Rs. 90 Lakhs had come to a standstill. Further, the non-renewal of the MoU with UNICEF caused planned activities worth about 1 crore not to take of at all. Most of the last year was spent on convincing the various partners and funders that this was only a transitory phase and that the university would fall back on track. There are no research/ extension activities to show as the University had effectively thwarted all such activities those were planned.

Chapter V

Academic Programmes

Introduction

The academic programme of the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (WBNUJS) has been designed so as to give the students a comprehensive exposure to all facets of jurisprudence and the legal system and to prepare them to enter the profession with requisite knowledge, skills and values. It is no accident that within a short span of ten years, NUJS has acquired the reputation of being a centre of excellence in legal education.

In order to equip the students with a comprehensive understanding of national and international laws, a large array of compulsory, optional and non-professional courses are offered both at the undergraduate and post-graduate levels.

The faculty consists of specialists from various fields of law and a number of social science disciplines such as Economics, Political Science, Sociology, and History. Eminent scholars and various experts from different fields are regularly invited to deliver special lectures and interact with the students on important issues and topics.

The University carries out its academic activities through seven Schools, specializing in different branches of law and Social Sciences. Each school has a dedicated group of faculty members. They are not only engaged in conducting the regular coursework of their respective Schools but are also involved in various other academic activities within the School, like organizing workshops and seminars, conducting researches, preparing projects and bring out publications.

In accordance with felt needs, the University has established several Centers to focus on specialized areas of law.

The University provides opportunities and encourages the students to organize and participate in various extra-curricular activities and competitions within, as well as outside the University.

The students of this University have brought immense honor to their institution by earning accolades in Moot Court competitions and Debates in India and abroad.

Within the University, the Student Juridical Association (SJA) co-ordinates various extra-curricular activities through the literary and Debating Society, the Moot Court Society, the Cultural Affairs Committee, the Magazine Committee, the sports Committee and the Nature Club and various other Committee which has came up recently.

Different Programmes of Study offered by the University

The B.A. /B.Sc. LL.B. (Hons.) Degree Programme attracts school (Higher Secondary) leaving bright young aspirants to the field of law. The five-year undergraduate course is divided into ten semesters. The students represent almost all the states of India including foreign countries. This programme exposes the students to Indian modes of legal education (which emphasize critical thinking and self-inquiry) as well as to procedure and substantive law. It also enhances the students' ability to do advanced scholarly work. During the period under report 2018 - 19, 158 (119+39) students have passed out and will be awarded the degree of LL.B. & LL.M. during the Fourteenth Convocation to be held in the recent months.

The *LL.M. Degree Programme* is a one-year post-graduate course with 42 seats. This programme has been so devised as to attract intellectually curious and thoughtful candidates. In **2018 – 19**, 39 students (including batch repeaters) will be awarded this degree during the **Fourteenth Convocation** to be held in the recent months.

With effect from 2013, the University has adopted one-year *LLM Programme* as per the direction of U.G.C. All the students of Post Graduate (LL.M) are admitted through CLAT (Common Law Admission Test) during the academic year 2018-19, 42 students were admitted.

During the Academic year 2018-19, 10 candidates were admitted for Ph.D. course and the 5 candidates will be awarded Ph.D. Degree for the Academic year 2018-19.

Chapter IX

Library

Growth of NUJS library over the past one year both in volume and quality of content has been significant and sustained.

Books & Journals: As of 31 March 2019 the library collection stood at 20361 in addition to gifted books which were 6545. A total of 264 titles were purchased + 116 titles that were gifted were added to the book collection.

The library renewed its subscription to 80 journals including leading international publications. Where options permitted print online versions were subscribed to.

Online Databases: The library renewed its subscription to 12 online databases

New Databases: Bloomsbury Collection and Taxmann Online was added to the growing list of databases.

E-books: 43 e-books were added to the collection which now was at 820 e-books.

Expenditure: Amount spent for this period was as follows:

Books & E-Books: Rs. 2,96,774.00

Journals& Online Databases: Rs. 46,19,045.00

Infrastructure: Rs. 5,57,973.00

External Users: The library also provided access to over 650 persons in the past year. This included students from other national and international universities, practicing advocates, academics and professionals.

24x7: As per norm Library access was made available to students 15 days prior to and during the entire duration of their end semester examinations 24x7. It remained open 20 hours on other days.

Facilities: Printing, photocopying. scanning were continued.

Chapter X

Journals of the University

NUJS Law Review

The NUJS Law Review, launched in 2008, is the most effective journal of The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), Kolkata. The Journal is a student-initiative and a brainchild of our Former Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. M.P. Singh. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. P. Ishwara Bhat has currently served as the Editor-in-Chief till he resigned from his office. Presently the post is vacant till a new Vice Chancellor is appointed. It is managed by a 'Board of Editors' and a body of Associate Members, and provides an exclusive platform to the student and faculty community at NUJS and outside, to publish their work.

The Journal has slowly gained importance in the legal arena. The professional and academic circles in India found it most effective for quality legal research. It is the only Law Review to be published by any National Law School on a quarterly basis. The Washington and Lee University School of Law ranking of law journals NUJS Law Review ranked with the highest score from India a couple of years back.

Journal of Indian Law and Society (JILS)

The Indian Juridical Review – has been re-christened as Journal of Indian Law and Society and has already been published. The main objective of the journal is to analyze recent and past legal issues through a prism of sociology, political sciences, history, economics and other social sciences.

The Journal of Indian Law and Society continued in its work of being a forum for inter-disciplinary scholarship and debate and its progress has been quite impressive.

Chapter XI

Endowments

Prof. N. R. Madhava Menon Media Law Endowment

On April 2001, WBNUJS received an endowment of Rs. 3 Lakhs from the founder Vice Chancellor of NUJS, Professor N. R. Madhava Menon, for promotion of the scholarship in Media Law, a subject he himself taught at WBNUJS. The Executive Council of the University, vide Resolution No. 5 of 2.2.2002, approved the Media Law Endowment Fund, and directed a long-term deposit to accrue the best interest possible.

Proceeds from the endowment are intended to be utilized for one or more of the following activities to be organized by the University on the recommendation of the Faculty Council and the Vice Chancellor.

Keshab Chandra Basu Endowment on Law & Economics

Professor Kaushik Basu, Professor of Economics in Cornell University, USA, and son of Late Mr. Keshab Chandra Basu, who was a lawyer and a politician of repute in post independence Bengal, desired to give an endowment of Rs. 3 lakhs to promote the study of law-economics interface in WBNUJS. The Academic Council, and the Executive Council, in their meetings dated 26.10.2002, welcomed the offer and directed the University to set up the "Keshab Chandra Basu Memorial Lecture in Law and Economics" and authorized the Vice Chancellor to proceed with the various other related academic programmes.

It was decided that the University would organize a lecture series every year, by inviting distinguished scholars in the field from different parts of the world. Professor Basu had also promised to help in bringing such scholars to NUJS. Professor Amartya Sen delivered the first Keshab Chandra Basu Memorial Lecture on "Law, Economics and Social Change", on December 20, 2003.

Scholarly eminent personalities in the field of Law and other allied fields like Professor Pranab Bardhan, Mr.Narayana Murthy, Chief Mentor, Infosys, Professor Joseph Stiglitz, Lord Prof. Meghnad Desai, Dr Montek Singh Ahluwalia, Shri Pranab Mukherjee, Smt. Medha Patkar, Prof. Ved P Nanda of Denver, Mr. Lawrence Liang, Dr. M. Govinda Rao have visited this University to deliver this Lecture in this University.

Chapter XII

RECURITMENT PROGRAMME - PLACEMENTS & HIGHER STUDIES

The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), Kolkata recorded the highest number of placements across all National Law Universities (NLUs) in the country for the graduating Batch of 2019. A total of 121 job offers were made to the Batch with many students receiving multiple job offers. A total of 90studentsaccepted job offersexcluding the students who had standing job offers but decided to opt for alternative career options.

The average annual packages offered by foreign law firms ranged from INR 42-46 lakhs and bytop domestic law firms ranged from INR 15-18 lakhs. Students joining companies in the role of in-house counsels received packages ranging from INR 12-14 lakhs.

Notably, the students in the Batch of 2019 have also opted for a range of diverse career paths. A substantial number of students opted out of the recruitment process in order to prepare for civil and judicial services examinations while a number of them have opted to pursue higher studies in foreign universities.

Some students also opted for entrepreneurship. ODRways, a startup for online mediation of disputes by some students of the Batch of 2019 has carved a space for itself by being recognized by the Government of India as an organisation for dispute resolution through mediation. This performance by the Batch of 2019 is a reflection of continued commitment to excellence which NUJS has strived to maintain over the years.

The continued success of NUJS in providing stellar job opportunities for its students would not have been possible without the incredible effort of the CRC members, past and present, the support of our current faculty advisor, Dr. Anirban Mazumdar, and all other faculty members as well as the entire administrative staff of NUJS. We would like to acknowledge the fantastic support of our alumni network whose guidance ensured these results.

Moreover, the winners of the competition- Harshita Mahajan and Darshana Paltanwale who were from Symbiosis Law School, Pune were interviewed by the SCC Online and their interviews were published in the Blog Section of the site. Furthermore, the best essay from every theme was published by The Leaflet, 'An Imprint Lawyers Collective's' legal opinion portal.

2) Qriosity Quiz Competition:-

Continuing the trend of previous year, the QRISOSITY quiz competition attracted a decent amount of participation from various law schools. The questions of this year's QRISOITY were based less on knowledge of criminal law provisions and procedures, and more on contemporary criminal law events, judgements and theme of criminal justice. This was purposely done to reduce the obvious prior advantage the students from senior batches would have got and was aimed at bridging the gap between first year participants and Fifth year participants. Our effort as well as thought process behind the move bore results as a First Year student from GNLU i.e. Soham Mukhopadhyay achieved 3 rd position in the competition.

3) Judgement Analysis Competition:-

This competition was specifically organized to celebrate and critique the remarkable and landmark judgements delivered in 2018 in the field of Criminal Law. This competition provided a platform for law students to provide a holistic and an in-depth critique of the historical judgements of Joseph Shine vs UOI, Navtej Johar vs UOI and Independent Thought vs UOI. The students capitalized on this opportunity to boost their academic writings as well as research skills and their submissions reflected a thorough understanding of the principals of Criminal

Law, its interplay with society, and its relationship with the conception of morality. The competition was won by a team of Isha Rai & Danhvi Tripathi of Faculty of Law, BHU, while Arvind Pennathur & Shambhavi Mishra of NALSAR and Swagata & Prerona of NLUO finished as first and second runner ups respectively.

In addition to these flagship annual events, the SACJ successfully organized and attended a Workshop on Community Policing, Crimes against women, Children and Other Vulnerable sections at Central Training Detective Institute, Kolkata.

Furthermore, the Blog page and Website of SACJ were revamped and became much more active. Now our website contains blogs, articles, analysis and opinions on variety of issues circumventing around this field, be it Anti-Trafficking Bill, Mob Lynching, 377 judgement, Police Reforms etc.

NUJS MUN Society

NUJS MUN 2019 was the ninth edition of our Model UN conference it was held from the 11th to 13th of January, 2019. NUJS MUN simulated 6 committees, namely the United Nations Security Council, the State Reorganisation Commission, Winston Churchill's Cabinet, Pakistan War Cabinet, General Assembly and The Enron. Furthermore, we also simulated the International Press Corps. Further, an Intra-MUN was also successfully organized in the month of October 2018. Cumulatively, the event had 100 participants selected out of a pool of over 200 applicants. Delegates were from various institutions across the country including Jadavpur University, Presidency University, SRM University, VIT University, NALSAR Hyderabad, KIIT

Bhubaneswar, Delhi Public School, RK Puram, Modern School, New Delhi, La Martinière, Calcutta and St. Thomas, Calcutta.

The chief guest of NUJS MUN 2019 was Lord Meghnad Desai, A British Economist and Labour Politician, of The House of Lords. The Chief Guest of Closing Ceremony of NUJS MUN was Mr. Vikram Kumar from the prestigious Indian Mediation Week. The theme for 2016 conference was - India and the World. Owing to the widespread international participation in our conference, it was the Executive Committee's belief that year, there was concerted efforts in providing solutions to both historical problems as well as recent geopolitical developments. Alternative Dispute Resolution Society

I. OVERVIEW

The Alternative Dispute Resolution Society was founded in 2016 and since that year, has paved the way for a greater mediation and negotiation culture in the university. The Society aims at promoting and encouraging the usage of alternative dispute resolution methods to resolve disputes and in furtherance of this cause holds. Several events throughout the year. As law students we have always believed that the knowledge of all forms of dispute resolution is essential for us to perform our duty as lawyers, and since ADR is the future of dispute resolution, it is crucial to expose students to its diverse facets. The purpose of the society was to spread awareness about ADR activities at NUJS and give a platform to anyone who is interested in ADR to receive training and represent the University at both a national and an international level. In furtherance of this purpose, the Alternative Dispute Resolution Society NUJS 2018 – 2019 has taken exemplary efforts in cultivating an environment in the university where students are given the opportunity to learn the nuances and

intricacies of the art of mediation and negotiation and also learn it through practice.

II. ORIENTATION FOR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS

The directors and members of the society conducted a workshop for first year students intricately explaining them all the facets of alternative dispute resolution and its imperative role in a law school environment. The procedures of both negotiation and mediation were even demonstrated, introducing them to this art. The success of this workshop was proven with a massive application for the membership of the society from the first year batch.

III. MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

This year saw the kick-start of the mentorship program. Students proficient in the art of mediation and negotiation were selected as mentors and students requiring any sort of help or clarifications regarding the process, from the internal process to writing the strategy paper was addressed by the mentors. This sought for a mechanism where every individual student was given personal advice and help. This saw a wide participation from students across all batches of the university.

IV. IN HOUSE WORKSHOPS

In order to provide more clarity to the alternative dispute resolution environment, the proficient mediators and negotiators of the university conducted several workshops in the Auditorium. The students were given the opportunity to ask questions and clear the doubts while practical issues and demonstrations were provided. Problems were circulated among the students that led to a plethora of creative solutions being voiced

out.

V. THE PACT WORKSHOP

This year was the first time, where PACT organized a two-day conference at NUJS. PACT is a firm comprising of people who share a vision of promotion of consensual dispute resolution. It aims to catalyze the developments of ADR across borders through its various initiatives implemented for communities across law universities. It helps students think beyond traditional concepts and ensures that students learn the mediation and negotiation techniques for both daily and professional use. Close to 75 students participated in this conference that involved role-plays tailored to facilitate participation. Certificates were also provided to the participants.

VI. MEDIATION AND NEGOTIATION INTERNALS

The students selected to represent the university in both national and international competitions are selected after rigorous rounds of the internal allotment process judged by experts in this field. This year, the internals took place in the month of August, seeing a massive participation from the General Body. The cumulative number of people participating was close to 250 (approximately), hence spanning the process to a three-day event.

This year, the writing of a 'strategy paper' was also included in the calculation of ranks in the process, bringing the internal rounds closer to the structure of national and international competitions. The judges of the rounds were renowned graduates from National Law University Jodhpur (NLUJ), National Law School Of India University (NLSIU) and National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS). Extensive feedback and areas of improvement was given and explained to every participant after their round. This has led to an improvement in the quality of the dispute resolution culture in the university mirrored by the amazing performance of students in

Competitions worldwide.

VII. THE ADR ODR INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP

In lieu of this ethos, the society has conducted various training programs such as the ADR- ODR Mediation Training Program conducted by reputed mediator Mr. Rahim Shamji and his team. During this program, students were trained over the course of 3 days in the subject of mediation, its practical usage and its methodology in December 2018. At the completion of this program, the mediators received a certification from

ADR-ODR as Certified Civil and Commercial Mediators. ADR – ODR International is accompany that is internationally renowned for its specialization in progressive dispute resolution and training in areas ranging from international conflict management to negotiation, mediation and arbitration. The purpose was to encourage startups and MSMEs to incorporate mediation clauses for commercial disputes,follow smart business practices, be compliance friendly and be updated with regulations and schemes which affects them. There were panel discussions on

smart and ethical business management practices, which the startup industry and MSMEs can imbibe from the beginning, and how commercial disputes can be effectively resolved through the process of mediation. These summits

The National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata, (NUJS) has become the first law school in the country to have its own student-run mediation clinic. This Clinic will be coordinating mediation awareness activities under the NUJS ADR Society and Indian Mediation Week (IMW), a pan-India mediation awareness campaign initiated by NUJS students which has spread to 102 cities across the country. It will also serve as a platform to provide pro-bono mediation services for cases and help enable better access to justice in India.

Teachers take it as a part of their routine job to set the questions, conduct examinations, evaluate and declare results, through the Examination Committee, headed by a Faculty as Convener and comprising of two other faculty members as members.

Chapter XVI

Finance, Accounts And Audit

Sources of Fund

The main source of finance of the University Fund is generated through revenue from the fees etc. received from the students, workshops and research projects, apart from the interests accrued from the bank. It also receives donations from individuals and institutions to support specific activities. Moreover, it receives grants-in-aid from the UGC and Government of West Bengal from time to time.

I Grants-in-aid received

The University received Rs. NIL from UGC while Rs. Nil was received for IPR Chair from MHRD (BP & CR Division), Govt. of India during 2018-19 and Rs. 221.94 Lakhs as towards the maintenance grant.

II Fees from the students

Semester and other fees received time to time during the year 2018-19 from the students form the major source of revenue of WBNUJS. Realisation of various kinds of fees from the students during 2018-19 as tabulated below aggregated to Rs. in crores:

Educational Loan

The University tries to ensure that no student is compelled to discontinue his/her studies due to financial constraints. It encourages students to be self-reliant. It has been so arranged that the students can approach any bank of their choice for a loan which is immediately sanctioned, subject to the observance of statutory formalities, with or without any collateral securities as the case may be. Banks when approached by NUJS students, have also responded favourably by quickly sanctioning Education Loans. State Bank of India, Oriental bank of Commerce, Punjab National Bank, Corporation Bank, Union Bank of India, Andhra Bank,Indian Bank, Central bank of India, United Bank of India and Allahabad Bank are some of the Nationalised Banks from whom loans have been availed by the NUJS students. Other Banks have also shown keen interest in this regard.

Investments:

The University fund investment in 8% GOI Bonds as on 31.03.2018 stands at Rs. 1271.76 lakhs, WBNUJS General Fund Rs. 1186.76 Lakhs, Provident Fund Rs. 50.00 Lakhs and Refundable deposit Rs. 35.00 lakhs. In addition, investment in other fixed and flexi deposits in nationalised banks aggregate to Rs. 8888.30 Lakhs as on 31.03.2019 for various activities.

Annual Accounts and Audit

The annual accounts of the University for the year 2018-19 was prepared as per the provision of the WBNUJS Act & Regulations. These have been audited by the statutory auditors, M/S.Sen & Company. Their reports are appended as Part-B of this submission.

NUJS: A Developing University

The UGC grants received by the University are utilized for general development activities under XIIth Plan. However, to meet the running expenses grants from Govt. of West Bengal as well as Govt. of India are very much required. The Govt. of West Bengal have started funding maintenance Recurring expenses grants w.e.f. April, 2017 on yearly bais which would aggregate at least to Rs. 509.71 Lacs till the financial year 2018-19.

THE WB NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF JURIDICAL SCIENCES

Annual Accounts 2018-19

Explanatory Memorandum:

The Annual Accounts of The W.B. National University of Juridical Sciences, Kolkata for the year 2017-18 were audited by the Statutory Auditors, M/s Sen and Co., Chartered Accountants, Kolkata. The Accounts comprised of Receipts and Payments Account and Income-Expenditure Account of the University for the year ended 31st March 2018 as well as a Balance Sheet as on that date. According to the Auditors, these accounts give a true and fair view of the affairs of the University.

The University is presently functioning at its full strength from its own building. While basic infrastructure is in place, the University is in the process of building up essential support services for lifting up the academic standards and improving campus facilities.

This is the "Eighteenth" accounting year of the University. Over the past years, the financial position of the University has witnessed progressive growth, as could be seen from the comparative study tabulated in Annexure "A".

Some of the salient aspects are mentioned briefly:

- A. The Govt. of West Bengal, as stated above, have started for providing financial support from financial year 2018-2019 in the form of Maintenance grants. The University had received Rs. 221.94 Crore out of Rs. 5.0971 Crores
- B. Accumulations in various funds of the University at the end of 2018-19 aggregated to Rs. 15734.40 Lakhs, an improvement of Rs.1573.33 Lakhs over the previous year.
- C. Value of fixed assets at cost including buildings stood at Rs. 4766.25.00 Lakhs as on 31.03.2019. Investment of funds including GOI bonds, increased to Rs. 10267.94 Lakhs in 2018-19 from Rs. 9429.81 Lakhs in 2018-19 i.e., an increase of Rs. 838.13 Lakhs over previous year.
- D. Total amount of fees received from students during 2018-19 was Rs. 1586.17 Lakhs, an increase of Rs. 90.04 lakhs over the previous year. Interest and income other than students fee stood at Rs. 1002.04 lakhs in 2018-19 i.e., increase of Rs. 259.42 lakhs from previous year 2017-18.
- E. Total running expenses of the University for the Financial Year 2018-19 was Rs. 1359.48 lakhs which was modest.

The Hon'ble Justice Jyotirmay Bhattacharya, Acting Chief Justice enquired from Prof. Ishwara Bhat his stand on the resignation issue. He responded by submitting that he would stick to his letter of resignation dated 28/03/2018 submitted to the Hon'ble Chancellor of the University and expressed his desire to be relieved from the duties of the Vice Chancellor with immediate effect.

The circumstances in which Prof. Ishwara Bhat had to submit his resignation without complying with the one month notice period provided for in the Regulations have been explained to the Council. Appreciating the urgency arising from these circumstances and his unwillingness to continue in the present situation, the Executive Council accepts his resignation by relaxing the notice stipulation of one month. It is accordingly resolved that the resignation of Prof. Ishwara Bhat will take effect in terms of Regulation 11 on the conclusion of this meeting. It is further resolved that he will be paid one month's salary in lieu of the notice period and all his consequential admissible financial benefits will be released at the earliest. It is further resolved that the acceptance of resignation of Prof. Ishwara Bhat shall be communicated to the Chancellor through the Acting Registrar.

The members of the Executive Council express their appreciation for the services rendered by Prof. Ishwara Bhat.

In view of the resignation of Prof. Ishwara Bhat and the post of Vice Chancellor having fallen vacant, an acting Vice Chancellor is required to be appointed pending the constitution of the Search Committee and appointment of permanent Vice Chancellor. Mr. Justice Ashim Kumar Roy, Former Judge, Calcutta High Court proposed the name of Former Justice Amit Talukdar to be appointed as the Acting Vice Chancellor of the University. The proposal has been unanimously accepted. The members would appreciate Mr. Justice Talukdar accepting the proposal of the Executive Council and assume charge immediately. The Registrar

(Acting) would communicate the resolution of the Executive Council in course of the day and request Justice Talukdar to accept the appointment and assume charge as desired by the Executive Council till such time a permanent Vice Chancellor is appointed.

Professor Ishwara Bhat will hand over charge to Justice Talukdar on a date and time convenient to Justice Talukdar.

Upon the acceptance by Justice Talukdar, the Registrar (Acting) shall issue and handover an appointment letter to Justice Talukdar on behalf of the Executive Council on usual terms and conditions.

The Search Committee will be constituted in the next meeting of the Executive Council.



The fund management shall be overseen by the Investment Committee of the Board of Directors of the University. Unless the Foundation agrees otherwise in writing, the Fund's investment policies and guidelines shall at all times require (i) The fund to be invested in a separate investment Account (ii) 100% of the fund to be invested in India and (iii) the fund to be denominated in Indian Rupees. Grant funds contributed by the Foundation to the Fund shall be invested solely in government or government approved securities. The interest from the endowment was to be used to support the salary for the Endowed Chair, travelling expenses and administrative costs. It was mandatory to reinvest 25 per cent (25%) of endowment income back into the corpus so as to maintain its value in perpetuity.

During the five year period beginning on the date of disbursement, the Principal contributed by the Foundation and any appreciation or income earned thereon may not be expended (except to any administrative costs with respect to the Fund) without the consent of the Foundation. After a period of five years from the date of disbursement, and until such time as the Foundation consents otherwise in writing, withdrawals from the fund was to be confined to seventy five per cent (75%) of the interest earned and dividend received in respect of the Fund and no net appreciation in the value of the fund may be expended.

As per modified term of Ford Foundation conveyed by mail dated 09/09/2008, 20% of the interest earned on the fund could be ploughed back in the fund i.e. 80% could be utilized for administrative costs etc.

Again on November 23, 2009, the Foundation instructed that the University's Spending Policy with respect to the endowment included in the grant notification letter dated 01/02/2005 and modification on September 9, 2008 was modified as follows:

"Withdrawals from the Fund was to be confined to not more than ninety per cent (90%) of the interest earned and divided

received in respect of the Fund, and no net appreciation in the value of the Fund may be expended".

From then onwards, the accumulated income by way of interest earned on the invested Fund have been utilized as per record for the purposes restricted only by the Foundation.

Meanwhile on the sad demise of Hon'ble Justice Altamas Kabir, the Chair Professor, Ford Chair on Human Rights and Citizenship Studies in earlier part of 2017, the Chair lied vacant. For that reason, the accumulations on maturity of certain fixed deposits amounting to Rs. 1,86,00000 (Rupees one crore eighty six lakhs) was invested in Government GOI Bond at 8% interest per annum which will be matured in 2023 with the value of Rs. 2,97,88,206 i.e. nearly Rs. 3 crores.

On 1st December, 2017, the new Chair Professor (Hon'ble Justice Tarun Chatterjee), was appointed and on 7th February 2018, Mr. Suman Saha, Research Assistant to the Chair joined with respective salaries @ Rs. 70000/- per month & @ Rs. 30,000/- per month.

After paying those salaries to them from the dates of joining, the interest balance in savings bank A/c. as on 15/06/2018 at SBI, PB Branch, Saltlake is as below:

- 1. Under S/B A/c. Rs. 41, 162:00
- 2. Under MOD A/c. Rs. 81,973.00

The payments are normally made by using S/B A/c. balance as the MOD A/c. is giving higher rate of interest; So any withdrawal from that Account will be a financial loss to the University.

It is apparent that the S/B account balance as shown above will not be able to meet the requirement of Rs. one lakh for payment of salary and full withdrawal cannot be made without keeping minimum balance unless it is closed.



SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

- The Financial Statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost and with fundamental assumption on Going-Concern Concept.
- 2. Items of expenditure are recognized on accrual basis. Income is recognized on cash/ accrual basis.
- 3. Revenue recognition:
 - (i) Interest on Investment is recognized on accrual basis
 - (ii) Interest on earmarked funds are credited to the respective bank accounts.
- All Depreciable/Fixed assets are shown at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes, incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition.
- 5. Depreciation is provided on all depreciable assets applying rates as per Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 6. The value of inventory is recognized at cost price following weighted average method of valuation of closing stock.
- 7. Investments are carried at cost.
- 8. Grants from State Government/and UGC/Funds received for different sponsored projects are directly credited to University main account. Funds are transferred to their respective accounts subsequently for conducting their activities and for calculation of interest provided against the amount.
- Foreign Currency Transactions:
 Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction.
- 10. Salaries, Allowances and Retirement Benefits:
 - Salaries and allowances are accounted on payment basis.
 - (ii) No provision for Gratuity has been provided in the books of accounts.
 - (iii) Leave encashment is accounted for on payment basis.



B) NOTES ON ACCOUNTS:

- 1. Rent payable by the Corporation Bank from July 2008 onwards is under review and in negotiation with bank authority. Rent credited to WBNUJS account is shown as rent receivable under current assets as the matter is yet to be solved.
- 2. Municipal tax demanded by Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation is under negotiation with the proper authority and University prayed for exemption for payment of any tax, as the University is running solely for education purpose and not for profit. The matter is pending with Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation.
- 3. No provision has been made in the accounts towards Municipal Tax for the year 2018-19 like earlier years as no demand has been received from concerned authority.
- 4. In pursuance to our report of earlier years, we again recommend introduction of Internal Audit of the University.
- 5. We observe that the balance in following CLSB bank accounts viz.
 - **❖** WBNUJS Main Account
 - ❖ P.F Account
 - Staff Welfare Account
 - **❖** Moot Court Account
 - CLAT Account
 - Depreciation Account

Are not in agreement with the balance as per books and we find that a number of entries are awaiting to be accounted for several years. University authority should take necessary steps to reconcile the Interest amount in respective bank accounts.

- 6. WBNUJS Students Fees account was reconciled and it was found that Students Fees paid in the form of demand draft could not be matched due to change in the demand draft number system by the bank. Amount received as student fees through NEFT/RTGS was not fully reconciled.
- 7. Advance given to the staff and students should be adjusted within the particular Financial Year and adjustment should not be kept pending for a long time.
- 8. Reconciliation of Employees Provident Fund advances, P.F. amount payable is in progress.

- 9. Ascertaining of Provident Fund payable amount for the FY 2018-19 is in process. PF payable for the FY 2017-18 also remains unpaid during our audit period amounting to Rs. 11,78,439.00 and paid subsequently on May 2019.
- 10. UGC Grant received under XI-th Plan has not been fully utilized. However UGC grant received under XII-th Plan has been utilized fully.
- 11. Interest received from Banks for various projects and endowments fund are not accounted under specific projects/ endowment fund. The said amount credited to general fund accounts. It is suggested that now onwards interest on different projects/ endowment funds should be transferred to respective accounts.
- 12. Govt. grant received from W.B. Judicial Dept. is utilized initially in the F.Y. 2018-2019 towards expenditure from the University account, which is subsequently to be adjusted on receipts of Govt. grants.
- 13. No provision for Income tax is considered as the University is registered as a charitable Institution u/s 12A (a) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 14. Schedules '1' to '15' form an integral part of accounts.
- 15. Figures of previous year have been provided wherever necessary.
