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4.Examination Rules for B.A./B.Sc. LL.B. (Hons.) Programme:

The rules regarding examination matters are already in place and finalised. In view of changes in pedagogy and attendance requirement few amendments need to be incorporated in the present examination rules. The proposed changes in examination rules have been given in Annexure -4.

Annexure - 4

A Committee was set up on 26.03.2009 by Prof. M.P. Singh to look into the feasibility of existing evaluation pattern of B.A./B.Sc. LL.B. (Hons.) courses of WBNUJS. The Committee was constituted with Prof. Sudhir Krishnaswami, Professor of Law, Prof. Shamnad Basheer, Professor IP Chair and Dr. Arup Kumar Poddar, Associate Professor of Law. The committee proposed some substantial changes in the existing evaluation pattern and the matter was discussed in the faculty meeting of 26.03.2009 and 31.03.2009. The following are the proposal/resolutions of the committee, submitted for directions:

7. There shall be ten tutorials each Semester. Hence, students will write ten essays each term. Two essays will be written on each course every term.
8. The essays shall carry 15 marks to be evaluated by the subject teacher. In addition the tutor shall evaluate each student for their participation in class for 5 marks.
9. The Course Teacher shall prepare 2 tutorial questions and a reading list for the term.
10. The six tutors shall be selected preferably from 5th and 4th year batch of LL.B.
11. The tutors shall be selected by a Committee of faculty members comprising the 1st Year Teachers for the Semester.
12. Tutors shall be given a Certificate after successful completion of the assignment.

tutorials is to develop better understanding of the course materials and methods.

The secondary objective of the tutorials is to acquaint the students with the methods of research, analytical thinking and writing skills essential for an academic and professional career.

This tutorial shall be applicable only to forthcoming first year batch.

CHANGES IN EXAMINATION RULES

1. Attendance up to 9 % may be condoned for students who represent the University in any University authorized competition.
2. Project must be submitted within four days from the last date of submission. No project shall be accepted after the expiry of four days from the last date. The students falling in that category shall be deemed to have not submitted the project and shall be marked accordingly. Those who submit their project within four days from the last date shall be subjected to deduction of 0.5 marks per day up to fourth day, after which no project shall be accepted. However, for the students of 1st to 2nd semester instead of project tutorials will be applicable.
3. Any student, who cannot take the end semester examination due to illness, must inform the University immediately and definitely before the commencement of examination. The University will constitute a medical board for that student and if the board reports that the student is not in a position to give examination, the University may organize a separate examination for that student.
4. Project exemption is allowed for those members of editorial board whose contribution has been accepted for publication in NUJS Law Review. However, this would apply to the students of 3rd to 10th Semester.
5. All projects are to be submitted directly to the examination section. No member of the faculty is supposed to accept any project directly from the student.

5. Attendance Rules for B.A./B.Sc. LLB. Programme:

Finding several incurable irregularities in assigning 5 marks for attendance and support of students for scrapping of marks for attendance, those marks have been scrapped and added to the end semester examination raising it from 60 to 65. Further to ensure good attendance in the class, demanded by the students, attendance requirement for eligibility to appear in the end semester exam is proposed to be raised to 75 percent with a provision for relaxation upto 9 percent in case of authorized leave for student activities and medical grounds so as to maintain the Bar Council requirements of 66 per cent attendance.

3. Marks for attendance- This is applicable for both compulsory and optional courses. Students who secure 75% and above attendance will be given marks as provided below. There shall be no marks for attendance below 75%.

Explanation 1: For the purpose of calculating percentage of attendance for awarding marks, authorized leave shall be considered as attendance.

Explanation 2: Calculation of percentage for the purpose of awarding marks shall be made on the basis of total classes held in the particular course. *

4. Eligibility to write examination- To be eligible to appear for a course in the End Semester Examination, a student shall have to acquire a minimum of 66% attendance.

Explanation: Calculation of percentage for the purpose of ascertaining eligibility, authorized leave shall not be considered as attendance. *

5. Grounds for authorized leave –

- Students shall be granted authorized leave on any of the following grounds on application, supported by valid documents to the Examination Committee and approved by the committee.
- Students seeking authorized leave shall submit the duly filled in prescribed proforma within seven days from the last day of absence with supporting documents.
- The grounds on which such an application may be made are—

I. Health grounds:

- Absence due to hospitalization;
- Absence due to contagious disease;
- Absence in pursuance of medical advice for bed rest;
- Absence on medical ground other than the above mentioned cases which the Examination committee may consider as sufficient.

II. Volunteering for University programme: Students may volunteer for programmes organized/approved by the University. In such circumstances, the student shall get the approval in writing of the concerned Faculty-in-charge/Faculty Advisor. The names of the volunteers shall be forwarded by the Faculty-in-charge/Faculty Advisor to the SJA Faculty Advisor for approval. Such authorization shall be done as per Part IX of this rule.

III. For Research and participation in Moot Court Competition:

- a research within the State of West Bengal;
- b. research outside the State of West Bengal;



Proposed Rule of Attendance.

Faculty Meeting Minutes - 13/2/09.

1. This faculty meeting was held in continuation of the earlier meeting dt 11/2/09.
2. V.C. discussed the pattern of setting of questions for End-Semester Examinations in which guidelines would be given.
3. Faculty evaluation exercise is to be supervised by MR A. Mazumdar.
4. Academic Calendar -
Summer Vacation, Puya Vacation and Semester Break have been deferred for the present.
5. S.T.A representation in the faculty meeting in reference to internship and Academic Calendar leave was also deferred.
6. Attendance - V.C. discussed that students want attendance from 66% to 75%. This was approved in the faculty meeting but would be applicable from next semester.
7. Preparatory Leave - Approved for 3-4 days from 26th Feb, 09 - 1st March, 09.

6. Increase in intake of LL.M. programme:

To make it academically viable as well as to facilitate the scope for higher learning in law it is proposed that the total number LL.M, seats may be increased to 20(twenty) from the existing 10 (Ten) of which 2 (two) seats are reserved for Foreign Nationals. Reservations for S.C & STs may also be provided.

7. Evaluation Scheme for LL.M. programme:

Presently marks for two presentations and projects of 20 marks each in every LL.M course are awarded by the teacher teaching the course. The same teacher also sets the question paper for the end semester exam. But the end semester exam scripts are marked by an external examiner. In several new and highly specialised courses, the University faces the difficulty of finding a competent examiner. The external examiners also often delay results. It is proposed that the end term exam scripts may also be marked by the course teacher. For ensuring quality and fairness in the award, appropriate powers and responsibilities may be assigned to the P.G. Council.

8. Reporting on ILSA International Conference 2009:

The University has received the proposal from ILSA International Conference Organizing Committee that ILSA International Conference shall be held in WBNUJS. To organize this conference the total budget has been fixed to Rs. 11,33,800/- (Rupees eleven lac thirty three thousand eight hundred) only. In this regard the committee has demanded from the university a grant of Rs. 4,68,800/- (Rupees four lac sixty eight thousand eight hundred) only. However, the Standing Committee of Executive Council in its meeting dated 16/05/2009 has agreed that the University may pay Rs. 200000/- (Rupees two lac) only.

With great pleasure and enthusiasm we inform you that NUJS has won the bid to host the International Law Students Association (ILSA) International Conference 2009. The ILSA International Conference was started last year in a bid for greater involvement of non-US chapters of the ILSA in its events. The NUJS chapter of ILSA, along with its counterparts the world over had submitted a bid to the programs committee of the ILSA to win this bid. The ILSA International Conference 2008, held at Belo-Horizonte, Brazil, was a tremendous success, with over 300 students taking part from all over the world. We sincerely hope that the 2009 edition does not fall short of the mark set by the 2008 conference.

As an organization, ILSA seeks to promote awareness, study, and understanding of international law and related issues; encourage communication and cooperation among law students and lawyers internationally; contribute to legal education; promote social responsibility in the field of law; increase opportunities for students to learn about other cultures and legal systems worldwide; and publicize educational and career opportunities in international law. ILSA has clearly achieved the goals it set for itself, with many prestigious international scale events under its banner, such as the Jessup Moot Competition.

This would be one of the biggest student conferences held this year across the world. Understandably, an event of this magnitude would require meticulous planning in advance and an extraordinary level of support from our University and sponsors. ILSA conferences are generally known to witness a large participation from students and this time promises to be no different. 

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN THE W.B. NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF JURIDICAL SCIENCES

THE UNIVERSITÉ JEAN MOULIN LYON 3 (France)

*Université Jean Moulin Lyon 3, an establishment with a scientific, cultural and professional character whose headquarters are situated 1 rue de l'Université, 69007 LYON
Represented by his President, Professor Hugues FULCHIRON*

And, W.B National University of Juridical Sciences a (Public /Private) establishment, situated xxx, represented by his Vice-Chancellor xxx

In view of the articles L719-10 and D 123-15 and following of the French Education code.

Article 1 : Scope of the agreement

1- The W.B National University of Juridical Sciences and the Université Jean Moulin Lyon 3, France (hereafter referred to as Lyon 3) agree to promote mutual academic cooperation for research and study in the objective of:

(1) Promoting institutional exchange by inviting faculty staff to participate in joint research projects;

(2) Exchanging academic information and publication;

(3) Promoting other academic activities including student exchange pertaining to the above-mentioned objectives.

Article 2: Execution modalities

2-1 Exchange Faculty staff and exchange students will be subject to the same rules and regulations in force for visa and entry procedures in the host country as well as to the rules in force in the home institution.

Each institution shall make every reasonable effort to assist exchange Faculty and exchange students in finding suitable accommodation.

Details relative to student exchange as well as all financial issues will be subject to a special agreement.

2-2 This agreement shall remain in effect for a period of five years. This agreement shall be terminated or be modified by mutual agreement or by each party by written notice to be given twelve months prior to the termination of the understanding. Commitments already in process shall be fulfilled.

Article 3 : Financial modalities

Each institution agrees to waive tuition-fees for exchange students on a reciprocal basis.

Except as may be otherwise stipulated, the home institution shall not be responsible for any expenses incurred by exchange faculty and exchange students:

- expenses incurred by research projects,
- national and international transportation expenses,
- room and board expenses,
- honorarium, scholarships and other expenses.

Both institutions will work on joint programs in order to build the possibilities of joint degrees. Details relative to this type of agreement such as, length of study or exchange, the academic teaching and organisation, the academic and administrative management and all financial issues will be subject to a special agreement.

THE REPORT OF LL.B COURSE REVIEW COMMITTEE

The National University of Juridical Sciences has been established to disseminate knowledge of law and to contribute in the national development. One of its objectives has been to create a sense of responsibility amongst students to serve the society by enabling them to develop skills in advocacy, legal service, drafting legislations, proposing law reforms and governance. In its pedagogy, it has adopted inter-disciplinary approach to the study of law by integrating management, technology, international cooperation and development.

NUJS has tried in its own way for last eight years to achieve the goal with which it started its journey. Now the time has come that we look back and evaluate our own curriculum to gauge its relevance and update it.

With these objectives, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. M. P. Singh has constituted a committee, consisting of Mr. Anirban Mazumder, Ms. Ruchira Goswami, Ms. Lovely Dasgupta, Mr. Shameek Sen, Dr. J. K. Das and Mr. Prabhash Ranjan. The Committee has met several times over the last three months to discuss at length all compulsory and optional subjects offered in NUJS so far. The Committee has received suggestions from the faculty and students of NUJS. The recommendations of the National Knowledge Commission have also been taken on board. The Committee has also looked into the model course outline offered by University Grants Commission and Bar Council of India. The syllabi offered by other National Law Schools have contributed in formulating the recommendations of the Committee. The Committee acknowledges the contribution made by the earlier Curriculum Review Committee.

The Committee has recommended the introduction of few new courses, to restructure some of the existing courses and to convert few optional courses into compulsory courses.

The Report consists of two components, ie, Recommendations and Existing Course Outlines.

The Committee generally recommends incorporating detailed and updated reading list and cases in all the compulsory and optional courses. Introduction of sub topics and subheading in each module is also recommended.

Achievements and landmarks of the Moot Court Society of NUJS 2007-08.

- The three round internals drew a record crowd of 132 students in the first Round. The Judges were always former mooters of repute in every round.
- The MCS held very interactive post judging sessions to go with workshops and interactions with various former greats of the university like Rishad Ahmed Choudhury , Mohit Abraham and Deepto Roy.
- Held two challenger rounds successfully therefore making sure that the biggest moot i.e. Jessup is open to the entire talent pool of NUJS Students and not just those who grind through three rounds. This was done keeping in mind the large number of talent dropouts from the main process over the last two years.
- Our Biggest organisational success was the NUJS Moot Court Competition on Corporate Social responsibility in its 4th edition. The size of the moot nearly doubled. The standard of judging improved with a large number of law school alumni of NUJS, NLS and NALSAR taking their time off to judge us.
- On the winning front we broke our one and a half year drought with a Common wealth qualifying victory and the team represented India for the third time in a row.

- We won best speaker at BCI moot.

- But the highlight of the year is the success of the Jessup team that finally again reached the Washington rounds with Mr. Uday Joshi bagging the Best Speaker in the domestic (north Zone) qualifiers.
- Recently we have won International Arbitration Moot Court Competition, organised by National Law School, Bangalore.
