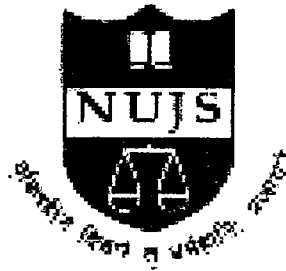

**INTRODUCTION**
