(Hons.) course. Mr. Purnendu Bairagya was not permitted to continue his B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) course under Academic and Examination Regulations, 2012.</p>

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Nearly five years have already been lapsed and he is still in the 1st year and could not get readmitted. On 6th March, 2020 his father Mr. Niranjana Bairagya was asked to meet to the Vice Chancellor/ Registrar to discuss about the future activities of his son but Mr. Bairagya did not turn up whereas Mr. Niranjana Bairagya, father of Purnendu Bairagya wrote email to the Vice Chancellor and Mr. Subhendu Bhattacharya vide his email dated 30th March, 2020 explaining the condition of his son Mr. Purnendu Bairagya. The same letter is put up for the consideration and direction of the Hon'ble members of the Academic Council.

Appointment in the post of teaching assistant

As per resolution of the 81st Executive Council it is resolved as follows:

"The Executive Council considered the proposal of re-designation of Guest Faculties and resolved that Guest Faculties having qualifications as per UGC norms will be re-designated as Teaching Assistants and will be paid Rs. 50,000 per month and they will be treated as whole time teacher of the University."

Accordingly, among the existing Guest Faculties having qualifications to be teachers of the University as per the UGC norms be called for Selection Process as per the University Acts

The Hon'ble members perused and recommend that the posts of Guest Faculties be redesignated as Teaching Assistants and accordingly appointment may be made amongst Guest Faculties and other candidates having qualification to be University Teachers as per UGC norms. Initially 10 such posts of Teaching Assistants be appointed.

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
