Although a purported reply has been received from Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik but not the information sought for. The Executive Council further perused and

The record reveals that, the said account was jointly operated, initially by Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik, Associate Professor and Mr. Vishwas H Devaiah, Assistant Professor and after Mr. Vishwas H Devaiah left NUJS during July, 2013, the Bank account was jointly operated by Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik and Mr. Sanjay

The Executive Council resolved to elicit from Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik, whether any research report or reports in terms to the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) dated 18/10/2012, which was signed and executed by her as the Principal Investigator with NFCG, have been submitted to NFCG or not. If submitted a copy thereof be furnished by her to the Registrar, NUJS.

Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik shall also submit the progress report of Research Project referred hereinabove with the statement of expenditure, within two weeks from the date of receipt of the communication.

B. <u>Under the Miscellaneous Item her conduct in</u> <u>discharging the duties in the University:</u>

1. The Hon'ble Members of the Executive Council have perused the conduct of Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik in addressing a letter in the form of e-mail directly to the Hon'ble Chancellor of the University and the Chief Justice of India on 6th November, 2023 by making various allegation against the Vice Chancellor.

The letter in the form of email addressed to the Hon'ble Chancellor and the Chief Justice of India by Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik against the Vice Chancellor is perused and noted by the Member of the Executive Council.

The Hon'ble Members noted that, according to the provisions of sub-cluse 9 of clause 9 of the Schedule to the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences Act, 1999, it is the Executive Council vested with the power to redress to the grievances, if any, of any employee, teacher and students. Therefore, if any teacher has any grievance for redressal of the same, he or she has to approach the Executive Council not the Chancellor.

The conduct of Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik noted above appears to be in gross violation of the regulations referred hereinabove.

- 2. In terms of the Resolution taken on the 91st Executive Council Meeting held on 17/09/2023, The Registrar, NUJS has sent an e-mail dated 18/09/2023 to Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik for furnishing the following documents with regards to the Research Project in collaboration with NFCG: -
- a. Copy of the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with NFCG.
- b. Copy of any approval for the said Research Project by the Competent Authority of the University.
- c. Work-in-progress of the Research Project if any as on date.
- d. Amount spent or withdrawn from the dedicated Bank for the said project.
- e. Any other information regarding the research project.

It is reported by the Registrar that Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik without furnishing the document sought for, sent a purported reply by making various allegations against the Vice Chancellor.

It is further reported that despite repeated reminders sent to her by NFCG for furnishing the Project Report and the Utilization Certificate, according to the NFCG, no such report and utilization certificate have been made available to them by her.

3. It is reported that The Centre for Financial & Regulatory Governance Studies, WBNUJS in the year 2017 started a certificate course on Real Estate and Land Laws, Benami Transaction and Debt Recovery in partnership with *Effulgent Educators LLP*. At the relevant period Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik was the Coordinator of The Centre for Financial & Regulatory Governance Studies, WBNUJS and a Member of the Academic Council.

The above decision was taken by the Academic Council at its 20th Meeting held on 22/04/2017 and Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik participated in the decision-

making process being one of the members of the Academic Council although at that time she was one of the partner M/s *Effulgent Educators LLP* but such facts was never divulged and suppressed.

4. It is reported that two Show-Cause Notices were issued on 19-06-2019 by then Acting Vice Chancellor, Justice Amit Talukdar and on 24-10-2019 by the present Vice Chancellor on the ground of her various misconduct in discharge of her duties as a teacher and for acting in violation of UGC Code of Professional Ethics as adopted by the Executive Council of the University.

Taking into consideration of the above facts, it transpires from the relevant records, being the agenda papers placed at the meeting, it is resolved that a preliminary enquiry be conducted.

It is further resolved that Dr. Md. Salim Ansari, West Bengal Legal Services, Joint Secretary, Department of Law, Government of West Bengal, be appointed to hold such enquiry as regards to the issues referred hereinabove and any other issues pertaining to same and shall submit his report within a reasonable period.

The Registrar, WBNUJS is directed to communicate this decision of the Executive Council to Dr. Md. Salim Ansari forthwith".

Action taken against the above two resolutions:

A. The Registrar on 22-12-2023 communicated the decision of the 93rd Executive Council and sought the clarification as directed by Executive Council. Copy of the communication is enclosed in annexure

However, Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik has not communicated anything about the status of the Research Project Report and statement of expenditure expended against the said Research Project within the said period of two weeks.

On 5th February, 2024 she has informed her inability to response the Registrar communication, copy of the

B. The Registrar on 22-12-2023 vide email communicated the decision of the 93rd Executive Council to Dr. Md. Salim Ansari, West Bengal Legal Services, Joint Secretary, Department of Law, Government of West Bengal. Copy of the communication is enclosed in annexure

On 04-01-2024, vide letter no. 22 – L, Dr. Salim Ansari, the Joint Secretary, Law Department, Government of West Bengal was formally appointed as Enquiry Officer to conduct a preliminary enquiry with regard to conduct of Ms. Vaneeta Patnaik, Associate Professor, WBNUJS, with due permission of Hon'ble Governor of West Bengal. Copy of the communication dated 04-01-2024 is enclosed in annexure.

The Report of the Enquiry Officer will be placed on table for the consideration of Hon'ble Members of the Executive Council.

The 89th Executive Council in its meeting held on 9th July, 2023 has also approved a seed money of Rs.10 lakhs and constituted a committee for operationalizing the Justice Dr. Radha Binod Pal Chair and preparing a suitable guideline for the Chair.

The draft Guidelines will be placed for considerations and necessary directions.

Resolution

The Executive Council has considered and accepted the Draft Guidelines for operationalizing the Justice Dr. Radha Binod Pal Chair. However, it is suggested, in addition to the subject covered under sl.no.3 in the draft guidelines, the Third World approaches to International Law shall be added as one of the subjects.

To consider the Report of Sub-Committee on Pension Scheme for Staff of WBNUJS and to create a Pension Fund for this purpose.

As per sub-clause (xxxiv) of Section 5 of the WBNUJS Act, 1999, the University has the power "to constitute for the benefit of academic, technical, administrative and other staff, in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by regulations, pensions, insurance, provident fund (which shall be governed by the provisions of the Provident Funds Act 1925. as if such fund were a Government Provident Fund) 19 to 1925. and gratuity as it may deem fit, to make such grants as it may think fit for the benefit of any employees of the University, and to aid the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds, trusts and conveyance calculated to benefit the staff and the students of the University"

Accordingly, the 87th Executive Council in its meeting held on 14-1-2023 has requested the Vice Chancellor to review the existing Provident Fund and Gratuity Rules of WBNUJS in the light of Provident Fund and Gratuity Act. It is also suggested to look in to the possibility of National Pension Scheme or any other Pension schemes for all employees and resources for

the required additional fund for this purpose. A consultative process with both Teaching and Non-Teaching staff to be initiated.

The Vice Chancellor has duly constituted a committee vide circular dated 3-7-2023 to look in to the feasibility of introduction of pension schemes for the employees of the University and the financial implications for introduction of such pension scheme.

The Committee has submitted its report and the same is enclosed in annexure. Some of the points and suggestions made by the sub-committee is stated below;

- a. The WBNUJS has adopted the Central Government Pay and allowances as per Rule-4 of Chapter II at Part III of WBNUJS Rules 1999 for its Teaching and Non-Teaching employees, even though it was established under State Act.
- b. The University follows a Contributory Provident Fund (CPF) as per the Provident Fund Act, 1925.
- c. The Government of West Bengal has not adopted the National Pension Scheme (NPS) for its employees, the NPS is mandatory for the Central government employees, joined the service on or after 1-1-2004.
- d. As per the Contributory Provident Fund rules, every regular employee needs to subscribe to the fund @ 10% of the Basic pay per month and the University contributes 10% of Basic Pay per month as matching contribution towards the Provident Fund.
- e. In case the University adopts National Pension Scheme (NPS) for its employees, the monthly subscription @10% of Basic Pay plus Dearness Allowance (DA) needs to be deducted and the University needs to matching contribution of 14% of Basic Pay plus applicable Dearness Allowances (DA) per month to its employees as per NPS Rules.
- f. Further, if University wants to join the National Pension Scheme (NPS), an administrative approval from the nodal Ministry is mandatory as per NPS Act.

Since, the Government of West Bengal has not yet adopted the NPS Scheme in the state, therefore, getting administrative approval for introducing the NPS for the University employees may not be possible at this juncture.

g. Therefore, the Committee suggests that opting for General Provident Fund (GPF), as per General Provident Fund Rules, no matching contribution is required from the University, only the employees will subscribe to their Provident Fund till the retirement. After, the retirement instead of the Contribution the University paid during the service of the employees the Pension will be paid after retirement.

h. While, replacing the exiting CPF with GPF the 10% contribution made by the University to its employees on monthly basis will be surrendered by the employees.

i. In case we opt for the GPF scheme, the University can have the notional savings of the 10% basic pay matching contribution currently paid on monthly basis to the employees to the tune Rs. 7 to 8 lakhs per month.

k. In case the University opts for GPF scheme, the accrued pension liability needs to be charged on the annual Income and Expenditure account every year as per Accounting Standard (AS15). The accrued pension liability will be apportioned every year and the actual pension payment will occur once the employee retires from the service of the University.

m. In case, the University adopts GPF cum Pension scheme, the present value of Pension Liability needs to be computed.

Accordingly, we have obtained an actuarial valuation as on 31-12-2023 by certified actuary for all employees and enclosed in annexure. The accrued Pension liability for the service rendered by the individual employees in case the University adopts the GPF cum Pension scheme the details are stated

<u>Possible resource for additional Fund for meeting the</u> <u>Pension Liability</u>

Create a designated Pension Fund Account and the following may be deposited in the said account;

- 1. The Contribution made by the University to all the employees on account of CPF scheme will be surrendered by the employees and transferred to the Pension Fund accounts. An amount of Rs. 7 crores as at 31-12-2023 is available in the CPF Fund of the existing employees as University Contributions along with interest earned thereon. In case, the GPF scheme is adopted the said matching contribution needs to be surrendered by the employees from their individual CPF Account.
- 2. The monthly contribution that the University committed as per the existing CPF Scheme @ 10% will be saved to the tune of Rs. 7 to 8 lakhs on monthly basis and in a year Rs. 80 lakhs (approx.). The savings can be transferred as university share to the Pension Fund on every year.
- 3. An appropriate one-time funding may be made out of the University General Fund.
- 4. The Interest earned out of the above corpus fund will be credited in the Pension Bank account.

		The Executive Council has considered the report and accepted in principle the proposal of Pension Scheme for the employees of the University. However, it has referred the same to the Finance Committee for its observation.

The WBNUJS Act, 1999, vide section 4 (1) states that, the objectives of the University are "to promote interdisciplinary study of law in relation to management, technology, international co-operation and development, to hold examinations and confer degrees including joint degrees in law combined with other disciplines and other academic distinctions, and to do all such things as are incidental, necessary or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the University".
		The WBNUJS Act, 1999 also provides the following powers and functions for the furtherance of its objectives;

Section 5 (i) "to administer and manage the University

and such Centre for research, education and instructions as are necessary for the furtherance of the objects of the University".

Section 5 (viii) "to establish such special centers, Specialized Study Centre other units for research and instructions as are, in the opinion of the University, necessary for the furtherance of its objectives".

Section 5 (xxi) "to establish and maintain within the premises of the University or elsewhere, such class rooms and study halls as the University may consider necessary and adequate and to establish and maintain such libraries and reading rooms as may appear convenient or necessary for the University".

Hence, in accordance with above applicable provisions in the WBNUJS Act, 1999, it is proposed to introduce the new course BBA LL.B.

Moreover, based on a comparative study among various National Universities which offers the BBA LLB courses such as NLU Odisha, NLU Jodhpur, Chankaya Law University, Patna, the BBA LLB course provides a deep understanding of business, law & regulations with essential business administration skills. It also enhances the employability in the corporate sector, opening doors to careers in corporate law, compliance, contract management and entrepreneurship.

It is also proposed to have Special Study Centre at Asansol, West Bengal for introduction of the said BBA LLB course. The Special Study Centre in Asansol, is proposed since, it has well developed infrastructure including Road, Rail and Air connectivity.

The Asansol town is surrounded by various Industrial township including Durgapur, Burdwan, Purulia and Bankura and having a Study Centre established by a National Law University shall cater and encourage students from rural and semi-urban areas to take admission.

Further, the establishment of a Study Centre by a

National Law University like WBNUJS shall create the following opportunities to the students from the state of West Bengal;

i. Presently there is a need for quality advocates specially at the Supreme Court of India from our state. The quality of teaching and research in National Law University will help the students from other states also. At present the WBNUJS admits around 40 students on an average from the state of West Bengal. If we establish a NUJS Centre in Asansol another 40 students will get the opportunity to study in the NLU set up.

ii. It is also observed that around 1000 students every year travel outside the state of West Bengal to study Law course particularly in KIIT University, Bhubaneswar, Symbiosis, Noida, Pune, Hyderabad, Amity University, Christ University at Bangalore besides other National Law Universities.

iii. Every year around 60,000/ students appear for CLAT Examination and seats available in various National Law Universities are limited to 2600 only. Therefore, the WBNUJS Centre will attract the students who were appeared in CLAT examination not able to get seat in the NLUs besides students from the state of West Bengal.

iv. The proposed NUJS Centre at Asansol has nearby Airport at Andal, which will make it vibrant for the functioning of the NLU as the students would join from the All-India basis through CLAT.

Hence, it is proposed to establish a Specialized Study Centre at Asansol for B.B.A.LL.B. Course in pursuance of Section 5 (i), (viii) &(xxi) of the WBNUJS Act 1999 and submitted for consideration and necessary approval.

The Executive Council has considered the proposal and the Vice Chancellor is requested to assess the feasibility and submit a report.

Prof. (Dr.) Nirmal Kanti Chakraborti, the present Vice Chancellor, has joined the University on 3rd July, 2019 (forenoon), based on the offer of appointment order dated 1st July, 2019 which was approved in the 67th Executive Council Meeting held on 29.06.2019. The offer of appointment is for a period of five (5) years from the date he assumes office.

Accordingly, the tenure of Prof. (Dr.) Nirmal Kanti Chakraborti will end on 2nd July, 2024.

Rule 18 (3) of Schedule to the WBNUJS Act, 1999 states that " The Vice- Chancellor, who shall be a Professor of Law, shall hold office for a term of five years, which shall be renewable for one more term only by a resolution to that effect by the Executive Council. Upon the expiry of his term, he shall continue in office until his successor is appointed and enters upon his office".

Prof. (Dr.) Nirmal Kanti Chakraborti, the present Vice Chancellor, has submitted an appeal for renewal for one more term under the aforesaid said rule.

In response to the above advertisement, we have received 173 applications, out of which 154 applications were shortlisted and called for interactions. Out of 154 shortlisted applicants 142 applicants attended the interaction and 12 applicants not attended.
